



Advanced Placement Guide

The Advanced Placement (AP) Program of the College Board enables students who have pursued college-level studies in high school to receive college credit based on their performance on the AP examinations. Below is a description of University policy concerning AP scores and credits.

Minimum score for credit – Except as noted below, the University will grant three credits for a score of three or higher on any AP examination.

Equivalencies – Below is a listing of the course areas for which AP exams exist with specific information about course equivalencies (where they exist), scores needed for credit, and the number of credit hours awarded. Except as noted below, AP scores generate elective credit hours and do not exempt students from required courses. Where a specific course equivalency is noted, however, the AP credit will satisfy a requirement that is satisfied by the equivalent course.
