



## The Dual Enrollment Program

### **The Dual Enrollment Program**

The dual enrollment program enables current high school students to enroll in University level courses at UDM while completing high school graduation requirements. The purpose of this program is to supplement a student's academic plan by allowing them to pursue upper-level coursework which would not otherwise be available.

Students are expected to continue working toward their high school graduation requirements.

### **Eligibility**

Interested students must satisfy UDM admission requirements, be entering at least their junior year in high school and have completed the highest level of coursework available at the high school level in the particular area of study. Students need to apply for admission, submit high school transcripts and ACT or SAT results, and provide documentation from their high school guidance counselor or other school official supporting their pursuit of dual enrollment at UDM.

### **Application Deadlines**

We offer rolling admission, however, it is recommended that students apply for admission for the fall term by August 1, the winter term by November 15, the summer term by April 1.
