Carney suffers stress fracture

Junior forward could miss up to 10 games

TRAVERSE CITY — Erin Carney's basketball season is on hold.

The junior forward suffered a stress fracture over the weekend and could miss up to 10 games.

Carney (St. Francis) was one of five DePaul players to score in double figures in the Blue Demons' 81-57 victory over the University of Detroit on Friday. She had 12 points, seven rebounds, three assists, one block and one steal.

But Carney was unable to go in Sunday's 74-65 win over Illinois-Chicago — the ninth win in a row for the 17th-ranked Blue Demons (9-1).

"We're still trying to figure ourselves out," Blue Demons coach Doug Bruno told the Chicago Tribune. "We're still very much a work in progress. And more than that, we lost Erin Carney, and she's the cement. To lose her (just before the game with a stress fracture), now we have people playing in different spots."

Carney is averaging 7 points and 9.3 rebounds per game.

DePaul faces Loyola on Wednesday in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

- Erin's younger sister, Elizabeth Carney, had two points and two steals Sunday as St. Xavier (10-1) beat Aquinas College 66-41 in a game played in the Virgin Islands.

- The Grand Valley State University football team won its second straight Division II title and fourth in five years by beating Northwest Missouri State 17-14 on Saturday.

Freshman red-shirt linebacker Jordan Munson (Petoskey) played in the game, but was not in on any tackles.

Other freshmen on the team include Alex Gilde (McBain), Chad Biggar (TC St. Francis) and Tony Thompson (TC West).

- Mark Morse (Harbor Springs) had plenty of long-range success on Saturday.

Morse, a sophomore guard for Lake Superior State University, drilled six of 10 3-point shot attempts in an 85-74 loss to Central State on Saturday. Morse finished the game with 24 points, three rebounds and one assist for the Lakers (2-7).

• The Northern Michigan University women's basketball team improved to 3-5 and 2-2 in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference with a 92-70 victory over Ashland on Saturday.

NMU junior Maria Kasza (Kalkaska) had seven points for the Wildcats. She also had two assists, two rebounds and one steal.

• The North Greenville men's basketball team lost its last game of 2006, falling 86-81 to Limestone College on Thursday.

Freshman Austin Randel (McBain) had 10 points and a pair of rebounds for the Crusaders (3-6).

• Sarah Jurik (Mesick) had nine points and Lindsay Lange (Manistee) six points and four rebounds as Hope improved to 7-0 with a 73-51 win over North Central on Saturday. Fifteen players had double-digit court time ranging from 10 to 18 minutes for the Flying Dutch.

• The Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Division III Southwest Football All-Star team was announced Monday and Carnegie Mellon junior running back Travis Sivek (St. Francis) was selected to the first team. It marks the third year that Sivek has been named to the All-ECAC team. Sivek finished the season as Carnegie Mellon's all-time rushing leader with 3,067 total yards. He rushed for 14 touchdowns and for 1,326 yards, averaging 110.5 yards a game. He now holds the school record for rush attempts in a season with 295 as well as most yards in a season.

• Third-ranked Grand Valley State improved to 9-1 overall as it defeated Spring Arbor 87-45 in a non-conference game Friday night.

Junior guard Courtney Hammond (East Jordan) scored a game-high 14 points, while adding four steals and two rebounds. The Lakers shot 63 percent, knocking down 34-of-54 field goals. Grand Valley recorded eight three-pointers and was also 11-of-13 from the charity stripe.

• Jeff Wierzbicki (Elk Rapids) had eight points and six rebounds Saturday as Aquinas College dropped a 65-62 decision to Hope.

• Senior Scott Parrish (Charlevoix) scored 16 points while freshman Richard Blair (Pellston) added seven as Spring Arbor edged Comerstone 79-77. Spring Arbor is 10-5. Andy Bronkema (McBain) had 18 points and six rebounds for Comerstone (8-6).

• Brandon McClary (Bellaire) was named to the all-tournament team in the Holiday Classic in Alpena. McClary, a forward for Muskegon Community College, scored 19 points in a 81-78 loss to Alpena in the tournament finals on Saturday night. He had 16 points and 14 rebounds in a win over Delta Community College in the tournament opener Friday.

• Junior guard Nikki Zimmerman (Traverse City West) had 10 points and five assists in Calvin's 75-50 win over Alma on Saturday. Calvin is 6-1 overall and 2-0 in the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association. Freshman Megan Hoblet (Cadillac) netted nine points for Alma (3-4, 0-2).

• Meredith Blazejewski (Benzie Central) scored four points in Adrian's 65-50 win over Roanoke College on Sunday.

• Freshman guard Robbie Harman (Traverse City Central) collected six points and three rebounds in Central Michigan's 78-76 double overtime win over Cleveland State on Sunday. The Chippewas are 4-5.
