Milton E. Wright Jr., 85, of Mount Clemens, died Sunday, Nov. 26, 2006, in Mount Clemens Regional Medical Center. He was born June 20, 1921, in Deer Trail, Colo.

Mr. Wright retired in 1980 after 38 years of employment in middle management and the auditing department at Michigan Bell Telephone Co. He later worked on a part-time basis in the office of C&C Heating and Air Conditioning in Ro-
