Dr. Fulgenzi drowned while vacationing in Surf City, New Jersey. He was born on January 24, 1933, in Detroit, to William and Rose Fulgenzi. He graduated from St. Anthony High School in Detroit, where he met his wife of 52 years, Carole Ann ("Kay"). He attended the University of Detroit, then Wayne State University School of Medicine, graduating in 1957 with highest honors status as a member of the Alpha Omega Alpha society. He completed a residency in Orthopedic Surgery in the Detroit Medical Center and went on to practice on the east side for 40 years, healing countless broken bones and painful joints with his skilled, compassionate care. He was a member of the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons and was past chief of staff at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Detroit and Bon Secours Hospital in Grosse Pointe. He served as captain

in the Air Force during the Cuban Missile Crisis. He was a member of the Italian American Society, Detroit Yacht Club, and Gentlemen's Wine Tasting. Family and friends remember him as an energetic, fun-loving individual who loved tennis, a good game of cards, fine wines, traveling all over the world, and entertaining at his cottage in Sand Point, Michigan. Nothing pleased him more than providing a good time for his loved ones. In addition, he was a devoted member and past president of the Grosse Pointe Sunrise Rotary, helping those less fortunate.
