

Gregory L. Ulrich, a partner with **Cummings, McClorey, Davis and Acho (CMDA)** and a member of the State Bar of Michigan Board of Commissioners, representing Wayne, Monroe and Lenawee County lawyers has been named to the American Bar Association House of Delegates for a new two-year term. Ulrich joins the other seven Michigan members of the Michigan delegation in the American Bar Association's 549 member policy-making body.

Action taken by the House of Delegates becomes the official policy of the American Bar Association. It meets twice each year at the ABA Annual and Mid-Year Meetings.

Ulrich previously served three terms in the House of Delegates and has recently been the alternate for the Michigan delegation. This year he was asked by State Bar President Tom Cranmer to represent the State Bar of Michigan for the 2006 ABA Mid-Year and Annual Meetings.

Ulrich's practice with Cummings, McClorey, Davis & Acho includes heading its real estate practice group. His practice also includes litigation and transactions, real estate, governmental and judicial matters, business and technology law and estates and trusts.
