Dearborn native named FBI's director of Michigan bureau

Andrew Arena is the new director of the FBI in Michigan, the bureau announced Friday.

Arena, 44, was born in Dearborn.

He joined the FBI in 1988 and has worked in New York, Ohio, Detroit and Washington, D.C. He served as an executive in the Detroit FBI office in 2001 and was promoted to chief of the International Terrorism Operations Section at FBI Headquarters in 2002. His most recent assignment was special agent in charge of the FBI's New York Criminal Division office.

He replaces Daniel Roberts, who was promoted to a post in Washington overseeing national criminal investigations.
