Proposal for Harmonie Park development to be unveiled

A proposal for development of the **Paradise Valley Cultural and Entertainment District** in Harmonie Park will be unveiled at 5:30 p.m. Tuesday in the Harmonie Club Building, 311 E. Grand River Ave.

The plan, developed by the **University of Detroit Mercy School of Architecture's Detroit Collaborative Design Center**, includes recommendations for land use, redevelopment strategies and cultural and artistic elements.

This past spring, the **Detroit City Council** approved an entertainment and business district named for Paradise Valley, which was a near-east-side African-American neighborhood with black businesses including notable restaurants and nightclubs.

It was destroyed by urban renewal and highway construction in the late 1950s and early 1960s.

The **Detroit Downtown Development Authority** owns four Harmonie Park buildings and several parking lots in the district.

The **Detroit Economic Growth Corp.** is currently reviewing proposals for the properties and also plans to launch major streetscape improvements next spring.
