(Bay News 9) -- On Election Day, Bay area voters will have the opportunity to pick their representatives for the Florida State House.

State House District 57 - Hillsborough County



Incumbent **Faye Culp** (left), a Republican, was elected in 2002 and re-elected in 2004.

Prior to that, she had served in the state House from 1994 to

1998, during which time she had the distinction of being the first Republican woman appointed to serve as majority whip.

Culp was also a Hillsborough County School Board member from 1988 to 1992. She was a past president of the Child Abuse Council Advisory and is a member of United Methodist Women.

She holds a bachelor's degree in business education from the Mississippi University for Women and a master's in education from the University of South Florida. She is currently working on a doctorate in educational leadership from the University of Sarasota - Argosy University.

Her Democratic challenger, **Yvonne Capin** (right), is a political newcomer. She is currently retired, although she was a small business owner for most of her adult life.



Her businesses include a jewelry store and a home-interior business.

She attended the University of Tampa, and graduated from Hillsborough Community College.

State House District 60 - Pasco, Hillsborough counties
