Dr. Zimmerman-Oster and Fr. Hipskind jointly supervise an Assessment Team composed of Mike Martin and Lauren Engle, the Ford Community Corps Partnerships with the assistance of Shereen Abdel-Hak, and Step Up: Be A Leader and Pay It Forward with the assistance of Kendall Payne, Shekinah.

A Steering Committee composed of strategic partners from Student Affairs, Student Life, and University Ministry collaborates with Dr. Zimmerman Oster and Fr. Hipskind providing strategic direction for the Institute. An Advisory Board connects the Institute with the broader University community providing input and feedback to the Curriculum of Service and Leadership Minor sub-committees.
