The undergraduate HSA program has five student learning outcomes that are assessed each year. We have at least two direct measures from course assignments under each outcome that we use with rubric to assess learner achievement of that outcome. Our benchmark for each outcome is that same: 80% of students will achieve a “C” or better on signature/cumulative assignments. (Example: 80% of students will achieve a “C” or better on Position Paper assignment in HSA 3010)

Outcome 1

Demonstrate an understanding of the current healthcare industry in order to create a productive work environment in a variety of health care settings that promotes innovation and quality care.

Benchmark: This outcome is measured at two different points during the curriculum by the following:

HSA 3010 80% of students will achieve a “C” or better on the Position Paper Assignment

HSA 4600 80% of students will achieve a “C” or better on the Emergency Plan and Presentation assignment

Outcome 2

Students will apply ethical, leadership and, management skills in their approach to their career, and their relationships within the healthcare industry and different types of healthcare organizations.

Benchmark: This outcome is measured at two different points during the curriculum by the following:

HSA 3585 80% of students will achieve a “C” or better on Case Analysis assignment

HSA 4941 80% of students will achieve a “C” or better on the Internship Project and Presentation



Outcome 3

Students will apply knowledge of collaboration and communication technologies, regulatory policies and standards in order to address the changing nature of the healthcare environment, healthcare organizations and the health care workforce.

Benchmark: This outcome is measured at four different points during the curriculum by the following:

HSA 3001 80% of students will achieve a “C” or better on Weekly Excel Worksheet

HSA 3100 80% of students will achieve a “C” or better on Legal Written Assignment

HSA 3450 80% of students will achieve a “C” or better on Case Analysis Paper

HSA 4610 80% of students will achieve a “C” or better on Health Policy Paper

Outcome 4

Students will apply business and organizational skills to effectively manage healthcare organization departments, service lines, or similar-level organizational units to ensure a culture of quality and safety in the delivery of healthcare.

Benchmark: This outcome is measured at two points during the curriculum by the following:

HSA 4600 80% of students will achieve a “C” or better on the Emergency Plan and Presentation

HSA 4610 80% of students will achieve a “C” or better on Final Course paper

Students will demonstrate critical thinking skills and a commitment to social justice within in their decision-making process for the purpose of achieving equitable outcomes within healthcare organizations.

Benchmark: This outcome is measured at two points during the curriculum by the following.

HSA 3300 80% of students will achieve a “C” or better on the Culture Written Assignments

HSA 4700 80% of students will achieve a “C” or better on the Evidence Based Memo Assignment

7. Results, Planned Actions, and/or Actions Taken -Briefly summarize the assessment results, how they relate to benchmark(s), and how you are using them to enhance student learning and improve program quality.

79% (15/19 students) in winter 23 of HSA 3010 earned a C or better on signature assignment which is below benchmark of 80% and we have unreported data for signature assignment in 3300. We have discovered inconsistencies in the rigor and expectations of assignments and rubrics for these assignments. We are working with CETL to standardize rubrics across courses and improve consistency of expectations in our courses. This will help align rubrics with course outcomes and improve quality of our program while enhancing student learning. To improve reporting, we have updated our program goals and objectives and clearly outlined expectations of faculty with timelines.
