HSA program offers students education that leads to positions in organizations, institutions and agencies that deliver quality health services.

Benchmark: This outcome is measured at two different points during the curriculum by the following:

HSA 3010: 87% of students achieved a "C" or better on the Position Paper Assignment

HSA 4600: 100% of students will achieve a "C" or better on the Emergency Plan and Presentation assignment

Benchmark: This outcome is measured at two different points during the curriculum by the following:

HSA 3585: 92% of students will achieve a "C" or better on Case Analysis assignment

HSA 4941: 100% of students will achieve a "C" or better on the Internship Project and Presentation

Benchmark: This outcome is measured at four different points during the curriculum by the following:

HSA 3001: 100% of students will achieve a "C" or better on Weekly Excel Worksheet

HSA 3100: 81% of students will achieve a "C" or better on Legal Concept Paper and Presentation.

HSA 3580: 92% of students will achieve a "C" or better on Case Analysis Paper

HSA 4610: 100% of students will achieve a "C" or better on Final Paper

Outcome 4 Students will apply business and organizational skills to effectively manage healthcare organization departments, service lines, or similar-level organizational units to ensure a culture of quality and safety in the delivery of healthcare.

Benchmark: This outcome is measured at two points during the curriculum by the following:

HSA 4600 80% of students will achieve a "C" or better on the Emergency Plan and Presentation

HSA 4610 80% of students will achieve a "C" or better on Final Course paper
