7. **Results, Planned Actions, and/or Actions Taken** -Briefly summarize the assessment results, how they relate to benchmark(s), and how you are using them to enhance student learning and improve program quality.

Last year there were no students graduating from the program. Final Projects are still being assessed according to the 4 program outcomes. The program is currently broadening its recruiting strategy by targeting Pre-Health undergraduates looking to take a gap-year to bolster their applications to professional schools (e.g., medical school). To this end, the program has proposed a 12-credit health care concentration (currently under review with the CHASS Curriculum & Standards Committee). With senior privilege, students could begin the program as undergraduates and complete the MA in one academic year.

On a related note, the program is awaiting final approval on a name change from Master of Arts in Liberal Studies to Master of Arts in Interdisciplinary Studies. The programs outcomes remain the same, but with a more intentional highlighting of the Outcome 3 re: interdisciplinarity.
