If you want the Leadership Minor, you need to work closely with Associate Dean Noah Resnick. Some start the minor early on (we recommend LEAD 2000 Sophomore year as an ‘elective’) while many will complete the requirements during their Junior & Senior years only. The semester abroad also impacts this.
