Leadership Minor Advising – Biology Majors

Four key recommendations:

1. Work with your advisor to see how transfer or AP/IB credits can help you out.
2. We recommend taking the Introduction to Leadership Course as soon as you can. Usually, a core course can be delayed and taken later in your undergraduate career.
3. The reason we have approved so many core courses for the minor is that, if you follow the recommended list, the minor should only add one extra class to your packed schedule (The Leadership Capstone—either PYC 4620 or LEAD 4000). This is called double-dipping, where a class can count in two sections of your degree evaluation—your major and your minor or the core and your minor. You'll notice LEAD 2000 is a triple-dipper. counting for the minor, IT5, and IT6.
4. It is CRITICAL that you select wisely from the advising sheet so you can get the minor in the fewest classes possible.
