This guide reflects the New Core Curriculum effective Fall 2017. Transfer students starting at Detroit Mercy between Fall 2017 and Summer 2021 will have the option to select this New Core or the Old Core. See Transfer Guides indicating "OLD CORE" for prior Core requirements.

The following courses will transfer into Detroit Mercy's Architecture Program. Students may transfer a maximum of 63 credits toward a Bachelor's Degree; course grades must be a C or better. Transfer credit will be determined after a portfolio of the student's work from the course is reviewed by an advisor in Detroit Mercy's School of Architecture. If transfer credit is not granted for the equivalent course, elective credit toward your degree may be awarded.

Entrance Requirements:

- Minimum 3.00 GPA based on 24 or more credits earned at Mott CC (and/or other accredited institutions).
- If less than 24 credits have been earned, a student's high school transcript is required.
