First Destination Outcomes include self-reported responses to Career Outcomes survey, National Student Clearinghouse data and sourced outcomes from LinkedIn. Less than 15% of the data collected was self-reported. Of that number, most did not report salary information. 2026 is the first reporting year of Master degree data for University of Detroit Mercy.

Career Outcomes = The percentage of graduates who are employed full- or part-time, in service or military service, and enrolled in continuing education

Per NACE Standards, International Students who did not self-report employment and/or were not enrolled in a post-degree program (based on National Student Clearinghouse) are reflected in the Career Outcomes as Unemployed/Not Seeking With agreement from the schools/colleges, graduates who passed post degree state licensing exams (nursing & dental hygiene) are assumed to be working and included in the employed full-time or part-time outcomes.
